Scapegoating & Online Harms

This week, we're looking at scapegoating and how the internet affect this. It's a term you've probably head before but may not not know what it really means... so lets have a look!

A "scapegoat" is a person or group that is blamed for something bad or tragic, without concrete proof.

So, "scapegoating" is the act of blaming a group or person for something bad that has happened, or that someone else has done

So why does it matter?

Scapegoating can be very minor or devastatingly serious.

A minor example would be blaming your brother or sister for finishing the cake (when you actually ate it yourself).

However, the Nazis blamed the Jews for all the problem in Germany which ultimately led to the horrors of the Holocaust.

Scapegoating can be incredibly serious and it's important to **call it out** when we see it.



As always, anything that happens in real life is reflected in our online lives. A lot of scapegoating occurs online. Commentators express their opinions, placing blame on certain groups, often without evidence.

If these views match people's prejudices, they can spread very quickly and become viral - even if there is **no evidence** at all!

We must **ALWAYS** stop and think before sharing something. Is this a **fair** accusation? Is there **proof**? How does **bias** play a role?



Scapegoating happens a lot in politics because politicians often want to place the blame outside of themselves.

This has been happening with Covid-19.



Trump has repeatedly referred to Covid-19 as "the Chinese virus", blaming China for the devastating effects of the pandemic rather than his own government's lack of action early in the outbreak

Criticized for Pandemic Response, Trump Tries Shifting Blame to the W.H.O.

The president said he would halt funding for the organization because it caused "so much death" in the way it "pushed Chinese misinformation," though he himself effusively praised China's handling of the virus.



Trump has also blamed the World Health Organisation for the spread of the virus, in an attempt to divert attention from his own failure to take it seriously



India





In India, Hindu Nationalist have been attacking Indian Muslims, blaming them for the spread of the virus.

This is a prime example of pre-existing prejudice leading to scapegoating in a crisis









In China black people have been blamed for spreading the virus, they have been banned from entering shops and restaurants, including a MacDonald's in Guangzhou



A Chinese minister, Zhao Lijian, made allegations that the virus may have originated in the US and been brought to China by U.S. military personnel in October 2019. All scientific evidence suggests the virus originated in a wet market in Wuhan.

Early in the outbreak, some right wing commentators suggested that Muslims were ignoring the social distancing guidelines and making the spread of the virus worse. **There was no evidence of this at all.**
